SMPA/CoBank Donation Breathes New Life into Summer Sounds & Farmer's Market

THE SIGHTS! THE SMELLS! THE SOUNDS! THESE ARE WHAT BUILD EXCITEMENT AND DRAW PEOPLE TOGETHER. THESE ARE THE ELEMENTS OF A GOOD TIME. THESE SENSATIONS CAN MAKE A PLACE SEEM MAGICAL AND GIVE VISITORS A REASON TO WANT TO SPEND MORE TIME THERE.

If you happen to be walking down Notorious Blair Street in Silverton on a Tuesday or Friday from June through September, you're likely to be treated to the sights, sounds and smells of the Silverton Farmer's Market or Summer Sounds Music Series.

The Silverton Farmer's Market supports economic development by providing an outlet for local growers and craftspeople, both with and without storefronts, to sell their produce and prepared foods like salsa and tamales. It makes it easier for locals to make fewer trips to other towns for their shopping and it helps promote health and wellness by providing education on healthy eating choices.

Summer Sounds amplifies the impact of partner events, like the Taste of Silverton, and the Antique Car & Truck Show, encouraging visitors to turn their day trip into an entire weekend. It also bolsters the Silverton arts community by hiring Silvertonbased musicians and it supports local non-profits by giving them the opportunity to sell food during the concerts.



When the SMPA Sharing Success Grant Evaluation Committee was presented with these two outstanding projects to strengthen economic development in Silverton, how could they say "no?" SMPA is giving \$1,250 to each project and those amounts will be matched by SMPA's cooperative partners, CoBank and Tri-State. Altogether, this represents a \$5,000 donation to support the Silverton economy. Now that'll make for a good time!

Tri-State's New CEO to Speak at SMPA Annual Meeting

San Miguel Power Association's wholesale power provider, Tri-State Generation and Transmission (Tri-State) is now operating under new leadership. Former CEO of Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corp. and Arkansas Electric Cooperative Inc., Duane Highley has taken the helm from outgoing CEO, Mike McInnes, who is retiring.

"Duane has spent the past 35 years working with two financially strong cooperatives," said Rick Gordon, chairman and president of Tri-State. "He demonstrates leadership collaborating with members, key stakeholders and public officials."

Tri-State serves wholesale power to SMPA and 42 other electric cooperatives throughout Nebraska, Wyoming, Colorado and New Mexico, and has recently been in the news as questions of renewable energy sources and long-term contracts have been mounting.

SMPA is one of those Tri-State members that is very interested in these, and related topics. "We are optimistic that Mr. Highley will provide the necessary leadership to take advantage of the opportunities presented by our evolving industry," said SMPA CEO, Brad Zaporski.

The state of the industry is sure to be one of the topics Mr. Highley will address as the keynote speaker at SMPA's Annual Meeting of members in June. Mr. Highley's visit to speak to the membership in person supports the democratic philosophy that underlies cooperatives like SMPA and Tri-State.
